How to Calculate Your Major GPA

- 1. Multiply the number of course credits for a Questrom course by the grade earned in the course (see chart below). This equals your <u>honor points</u> for that course.
- 2. Add the total number of credits for all of your Questrom classes.
- 3. Add the total honor points for all of your Questrom classes.
- 4. Divide honor points by total credits.

For example, you get a B in FE442, a B- in FE445:

	8 credits				22.8
FE445	4 credits	X	2.7	=	10.8 honor points
FE442	4 credits	Χ	3.0	=	12 honor points

22.8 divided by 8 credits = 2.85 GPA

Your MAJOR GPA refers to all courses with the Questrom prefix, while your CONCENTRATION GPA only includes the four courses in your concentration.

Because the concentration consists of such a small number of courses, The Feld Career Center considers it misleading to include your concentration GPA on your resume unless you have completed all of the coursework for your concentration.

^{*}Credits for courses in which you receive an 'F' should be included in the denominator of the calculation.
