Tuition

A student's full-time tuition pays for up to 18 credits (including PDPs!), and students taking more than 18 credits will be charged \$1,830 per credit for the overload

Except in the following cases:

- You're taking ES110 – you get a 1 credit increase (up to 19 total credits)
- You have a 3.3 GPA or higher at the end of the semester – with a waiver, you can get a 2 credit increase (up to 20 credits, or 21 with ES110)
- You're a senior 😊

If you take any more than 18 credits (19 with ES110), you may face an additional charge unless you meet the requirements for, and fill out a waiver.

A Note About Credits

- You should be registered for 18 or 19 credits
 - 18 credits – four 4-credit courses plus SM132
 - 19 credits – four 4-credit courses plus SM132 & ES110
 - I recommend this
- If you have advanced credits from APs, IBs, etc, you may consider registering for 14 or 15 credits
 - 14 credits – three 4-credit courses plus SM132
 - 15 credits – three 4-credit courses plus SM132 & ES110
 - But I don't recommend this

Expectations

Gateway Classes

- Meet C/C- minimum grade
- SM132
 - All sections are once a week
 - You must take your assigned section (same code as your SM131 discussion)
- EC101
- EC102
- WR120
- MA121 (should already be enrolled or done)
- ES110 – 1 credit
 - For people with last names A-K or those who aren't taking it this semester
 - 6 week seminar
 - Any section is okay!



Writing

- If you took WR111 this fall, register for WR112
- If you took WR112 this fall, register for WR120
- If you didn't take a WR course this fall, register for WR120
- If you took WR120 this fall, you're done

What about additional Questrom courses?



Choose 0, 1, or 2 of the following:

- AC221 – Financial Accounting
- QM221 – Business Statistics
- IS223 – Information Systems

Do not take 3 of these courses

If you have AP Statistics, you do not need to take QM221

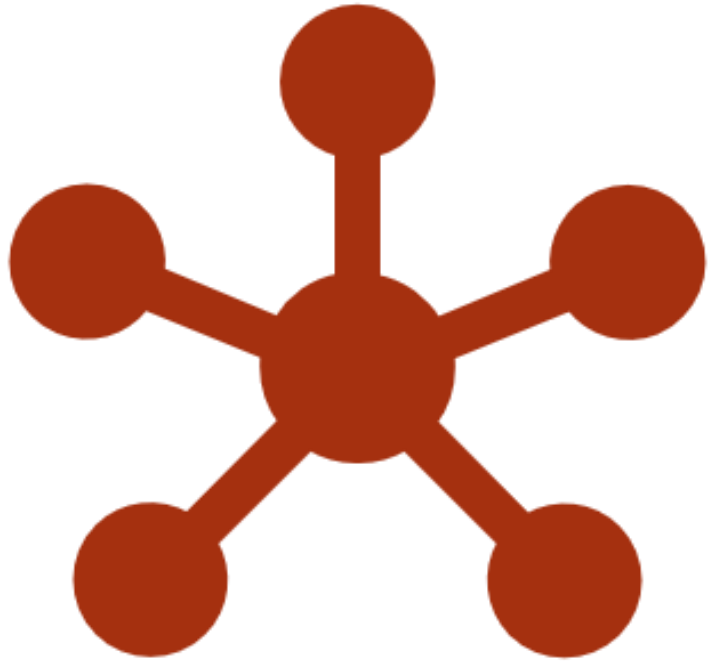

 - Once classes start
 - Questrom professors can't sign you into class until the first day of classes
